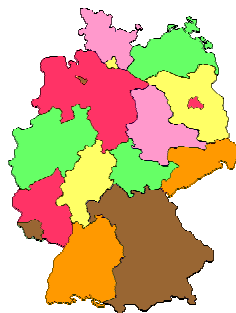


FLASHCARDS –REQUIRED PROJECT

GERMAN VOCABULARY ASSIGNMENT

Revised 3/22/07



Instructions: Getting Started: Go to google.de and type in your specific quarter culture topic using only German words.

1. Choose a **German article** (or authentic print material) **from a German website, written in German, by a German person** that matches your quarter **Culture** topic (use the first 1-3 paragraphs, choosing the first 50 different German words). No repeat articles allowed.
2. Make flashcards that are all equal in size (not bigger than a 3x5 index card). No typing.
3. Make a study sheet: German words down the left and English down the right. No typing.
4. Call your teacher over to check your words.
5. Copy each German word separately onto its own card, same color ink. No typing.
6. Please! Don't repeat any words. Don't include numbers, cognates, names or abbreviations.
7. Next to a German noun (they are always capital), add the gender word (*m*=der, *f*=die, *n*=das). *use a German-English dictionary (Woerterbuch) and/or leo.org to find genders, definitions and parts of speech.
8. On the back of the card, write its English translation in a different color. No typing.
9. Next to each German word, write its part of speech (noun, pronoun, adjective, adverb, article, preposition, verb or conjunction). Try dictionary.com.
10. Put the cards in an envelope (hole punch it), and write your name, period and date on the envelope.
11. Study your flashcard study sheet until you know the English translation just by seeing the German word. Call the teacher over when you are ready to be tested.
12. Meanwhile, staple your German article to the front of your study sheet. Write your name, class period, and date on the top prepare to be tested.

*Your work will be checked. If your project is complete and accurate, the teacher will choose 10 and test you on them. 10 correct =100 points, Less than 6 correct= study and try again on **another** day. Incomplete or incorrect work must be redone until it's complete and correct.*
