INDIVIDUAL ART PROJECTS:

Each student may submit one art project during quarters 1, 2 and 3 only.

Each project must have an index card attached to the back of it. The card should have the student's name, name of their school and the school code (RHS=55), as well as, a description of what the project is and what meaning it has.

Index Cards MUST be typed and attached to the projects when submitted. NOT handwritten.

Projects must be able to stand on their own, without any support from the walls. Projects must follow the convention theme, unless noted otherwise. Check the F.A.S.G. website (fasg.net) for this year's convention theme.

Two-Dimensional Art:

This includes drawings, paintings, prints, maps, graphs, flags, banners, coats of arms, etc.
Dimensions for this project may not exceed 3' X 3'.

Three Dimensional Art:

This includes sculptures, models, ceramic, pottery, jewelry, woodcuttings, carvings, etc. Dimensions for this project may not exceed 2' X' 3' X 3'.

Costumes:

This refers to costumes made by the student, not clothes which may have been bought. They can be life size or made to fit a doll. Costumes must follow FASG theme.

Electronic Media:

This includes videos, movies, computer programs, etc. If you plan to enter a project in this category in the state competition, you must bring your own equipment (VCR, Computer, etc.) with you.

Pictograms:

Depict a German word by using pictures of the word to create each letter.

Models:

Models are defined as: a replica or replication of a real structure and/or scene. Models do not have to follow the theme.

Read the F.A.S.G. Judging Forms to become familiar with the criteria that will be used to evaluate your project.
